• Update on fix of sinkhole near PDA stairs

Rob Allen gave update on a sinkhole that was 2.5x2.5x6' sized by the dunes between house 144 and 143 on the south side of the steps. It hadn't affected the integrity of the wall nor moved any of the rocks. It was about 6 feet on the inland side of the wall. Sam also verified-he backfilled the space to fill the air space-drainage rock, broken concrete and then sand was packed on top. The sand had just flowed through rocks. After the drainage rock was put into the hole they layered the area with bags filled with cut dune grasses, other rocks etc. to create more fill layers. This should act to slow any flow of water. Most likely cause was the old filter fabric has disintegrated in a few spaces.

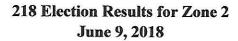

Resolution Adopting Annual Conflict of Interest Code for 2018

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-08

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act, Government Code Sections 81000, et. Seq., requires every State and local agency to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code, and

WHEREAS, the Board has previously adopted a Conflict of Interest Code incorporating restrictions and regulations set forth in 2. Cal. Code of Regulations, Sections 18109 et seq.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the Pajaro Dunes GHAD hereby adopts the Conflict of Interest Code, and all Tables appended thereto, copies of which are attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and by this reference incorporated herein, which shall henceforth constitute the Conflict of Interest Code for the Pajaro Dunes Geological Hazard Abatement District. In enacting this resolution, the Board hereby rescinds any previous resolution or Conflict Code adopted by this body. All persons holding designated positions identified in amended Table 2 shall file statements of economic interest pursuant to the Conflict of Interest Code.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR THE PAJARO DUNES GEOLOGICAL HAZARD ABATEMENT DISTRICT

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Section 81000, et. seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. It can be incorporated by reference and may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission after public notice and hearings to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference and, along with the attached Table 1 (Categories) and Table 2 (Designated Positions) in which members and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the conflict of interest code of the Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District.

Designated employees and directors shall file their statements of economic interest, as specified in this Code, with Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District, who will thereafter make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction. (GOV. Section 81008). Statements for all designated employees will be retained by the Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District.

TABLE 1 CATEGORIES FOR CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODES FOR PAJARO DUNES GEOLOGIC HAZARD ABATEMENT DISTRICT

<u>Category 1:</u> Officials and employees whose duties are broad and indefinable:

Investments, business positions, and income from source located in or doing business in the jurisdiction.

Interests in real property located in jurisdiction, including property located within a two mile radius of any property owned or used by the agency.

<u>Category 2:</u> Officials and employees whose duties involve contracting or purchasing:

Investments, business positions, and sources of income of the type which:

Provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of the type utilized by the agency.

<u>Category 3:</u> Agencies with regulatory powers:

Investments, business positions, and sources of income of any type which:

Are subject to the regulatory, permit or licensing authority of the agency.

<u>Category 4:</u> Designated employees whose decisions may affect real property interests:

Investments, business positions and sources of income of the type which:

Engage in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property.

Interests in real property located within the jurisdiction, including property located within a two-mile radius of any property owned or used by the agency.

<u>Category 5:</u> Agencies which Provide pooled self-insurance benefits:

Interests in real property located within the jurisdiction, including property located within a two-mile radius of any property owned or

used by the agency.

Investment, business positions, and sources of income of the type which:

The agency is empowered to invest its funds.

Provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of the type utilized by the agency.

Engaged in the business of insurance including, but not limited to, insurance companies, carriers, holding companies, underwriters, brokers, solicitors, agents, adjusters, claims managers and actuaries.

WHEREAS, on June 9th, 2018 a new assessment was approved by the majority of voters within the District which allows for the collection of funds for the establishment of a "Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund" to be used to pay for emergency repairs to the District seawall; and

WHEREAS, the new funds for the "Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund" will be collected over a series of years; and

WHEREAS, the District's Board wants to clarify and establish guidelines for the use of the funds that will be available in the "Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund";

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of the Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District states that:

1) The Board hereby adopts the Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund Policy, attached hereto as Exhibit A and by this reference incorporated herein, to provide guidelines and rules applicable to the expenditure of said funds.

Exhibit A

BOARD OF DIRECTORS PAJARO DUNES GEOLOGIC HAZARD ABATEMENT DISTRICT

Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund Policy"

This Policy shall apply to the funds designated for use as "Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund". The establishment of this fund was approved by a majority of homeowners in the 2018 assessment election certified on June 9th, 2018. The funds will be collected through property tax assessments for Zone 1 based on fiscal year budgets approved by the Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District Board of Directors at a regular or special noticed meeting.

The Board of the Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District hereby establishes the following guidelines and rules that shall be applied to the use of the Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund:

- 1) The "Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund" (Reserve Fund) shall be represented as a separate line item in fiscal year budgets.
- 2) The Reserve Fund shall be maintained in a separate bank account and funded from the property tax assessments collected by the Santa Cruz County Tax Collector.
- 3) The maximum amount of reserve funds that can be assessed in any given Fiscal Year shall be \$175,000.00, and the Reserve Fund will be capped at \$600,000. Once said cap is reached, annual assessments for the Reserve Fund shall be held in abeyance until such funds are depleted for unanticipated/emergency use and there is a need to replenish Reserve Funds.
- 4) The Reserve Fund was established to serve solely as a source of funding for unanticipated seawall repairs necessitated by events that may occur prior to the time comprehensive repairs and maintenance to the wall are planned, approved (both by the Board and other entities with jurisdiction over such matters) and financed.
- 5) Use of the funds from the Reserve Fund will require approval from the Board at a noticed regular or special meeting of the Board, except for emergency expenditures. In instances in which an emergency expenditure is authorized by less than a quorum of the Board, said action shall be considered for ratification at a duly noticed regular or special meeting as soon thereafter as possible.
- 6) This policy may be updated by Board action at a noticed regular or special meeting of the Board.

Resolution Authorizing the Board President to Establish a Line of Credit for up to \$600,000

Resolution No. 2018-10

WHEREAS, as is set forth in the Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District ("District) Plan of Control, the District was formed for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining and repairing the revetment seawall and riverwall located within the District; and

WHEREAS, on June 9th, 2018 a new assessment was approved by the majority of voters within the District which includes increased funds for operational expenses plus the establishment of a "Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund"; and

WHEREAS, the increased assessment will be collected the Santa Cruz tax collector through homeowner property tax bills starting with the 2018/2019 tax bill; and

WHEREAS, assessment funds will not be available from the County Assessor until March 2019; and

WHEREAS, the new funds for the "Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund" will be collected over a series of years; and

WHEREAS, the District's Board is concerned with the District's ability to fund the aforesaid duties should an emergency arise before assessment funds may be collected.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of the Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District as follows:

- 1) The President of Pajaro Dunes Geologic Hazard Abatement District is authorized to pursue the establishment of a line of credit of up to \$600,000 on behalf of PDGHAD.
- 2) The line of credit may be drawn upon to fund emergency repairs of the seawall until such time as the "Zone 1 Capital Repair Expense and Reserve Fund" is established and fully funded.
- 3) The line of credit terms will be presented to the Board and may not exceed 10% interest nor a term of 10 years.
- 4) The Board may modify the terms of the line of credit in the future by action approval at a regular or special meeting.
